## **WASHINGTON'S MOST WANTED HOST DAVID ROSE HONORED BY SEATTLE POLICE WITH THE CITIZEN'S AWARD**

(Seattle, WA – December 31, 2009) On December 30, 2009, *Washington's Most Wanted* host David Rose, was presented with the Citizen's Award by the Seattle Police Officers' Guild. The Board of Directors of the Guild voted to present the Citizen's Award to Mr. Rose for his assistance and support during the aftermath of the murder of Officer Timothy Brenton. This is the first time this award has been presented to a member of the media.

"It was a time that we were finally able to say 'thank you' for all that David Rose did for our organization, for our officers and for law enforcement across the state. No one has ever gone out of their way, on a continual basis to support law enforcement like David and **Q13 FOX** have," said Sarah Scott, Operations Manager, Seattle Police Officers' Guild.

Myrle Carner, *Washington's Most Wanted* Police Liaison and Director of Crime Stoppers of Puget Sound, was also awarded the Citizen's Award along with David Rose.

Seattle Police Officers' Guild President Sgt. Rich O'Neill said, "It's just our way of showing appreciation for all that *Washington's Most Wanted* and Crime Stoppers did. We truly believe that had it not been for the effort with the reward and all of the public attention we would not have caught a couple of cop killers.
