WASHINGTON'S MOST WANTED'S 118th CAPTURE: LEVEL 3 SEX OFFENDER WITH MULTIPLE RAPE CONVICTIONS FINALLY CAPTURED IN SEATTLE

(Seattle, WA – April 5, 2010) Thanks to a *Washington's Most Wanted* viewer tip into Crime Stoppers of Puget Sound, dangerous fugitive Eugene Wyndham is under arrest. He was captured by Seattle Police early Sunday morning at 8005 28th Ave SW and booked into King County Jail at 1:53 am. A *Washington's Most Wanted* viewer called in the tip right after the show Saturday night. The Crime Stoppers hotline operator forwarded the tip to Seattle Police who found him at the address and arrested him.

Washington's Most Wanted featured Wyndham this past weekend, April 2 and 3. Wyndham has been convicted of three separate Rape charges involving minor females. He was listed as homeless and was wanted for failure to register as a sex offender, Burglary 1st Degree and Assault 2nd Degree. Wyndham is a level 3 sex offender, untreated as he's never complied with sexual deviancy treatment in the past. He was placed on GPS tracking but didn't comply with this after the first/second night. According to police, Wyndham was known to roam downtown Seattle and spent a lot of time in the Ballard and Greenwood neighborhoods. He allegedly finds his female victims at Church and manipulates them into feeling sorry for him and getting them to take him off the streets. According to police, his pattern is to then steal from these women and commit domestic violence/physical violence/assault against them.

Wyndham has a long criminal history dating back to 1983 when he was still a juvenile. His other convictions include Robbery 2nd Degree, simple assault, taking a motor vehicle without permission, lots of vehicle prowl, malicious mischief, property destruction, theft, trespassing and false reporting.
